

HUMS' Dress code in educational settings

The Dress Code is based on the theory that learning to use socially acceptable manners and selecting attire appropriate to specific occasions and activities are critical factors in the total educational process. Understanding and employing these behaviors not only improves the quality of one's life, but also contributes to optimum morale, and embellishes the overall campus image. They also play a major role in instilling a sense of integrity and an appreciation for values and ethics.

The continuous demonstration of appropriate manners and attire insures that Hormozgan University of Medical Sciences' (HUMS) students meet the very minimum standards of quality achievement in the social, physical, moral and educational aspects of their lives essential areas of development necessary for propelling students toward successful careers.

Dress and Grooming

Hormozgan University of medical sciences requires that all students refrain from wearing inappropriate clothing in all classrooms, buildings and public places on-campus. This policy applies to students off-campus when engaged in activities representing the University (i.e. conferences, athletic competition, study abroad, etc.). Appropriate attire is required at all times on-campus.

Presenting a bodily appearance or wearing clothing which is disruptive, provocative, revealing, profane, vulgar, offensive, obscene or which endangers the health or safety of the students or others are prohibited. Failure to obey the prescribed codes and to be appropriately groomed as set out by the rules is a violation of the University Code of Conduct and will warrant the appropriate consequences.

At HUMS, appropriate attire includes the following:

- Male students should wear simple and common clothes including decent shirt and pants. Female students ought to wear comfortable and decent upper dress (known as Manteaux) and pants. The upper dress should be knee-length and should not have long slits or side cuts, which reveal the hip or thigh area.
- Pants should not be tight fitting or figure hugging; they should be loose and cover the ankles.
- Female students should wear scarves covering the entire hair, neck, chest and shoulders.
- For female students, any form of clothing that covers the whole face is prohibited.
- For male students, the hair length should not extend beyond the collar and the hairstyle should not be unusual or extraordinary.

- The attire should be made of non-transparent fabric such that the color of skin and the shape of body would not be visible or reveal the contour of body.
- Students should wear appropriate socks and avoid appearing in the educational settings without wearing socks.
- Shoes should be comfortable, clean, and have a wide toe as well as mild and proper color.
- Flip-flops, slippers, or open-toed shoes/sandals are NOT allowed in HUMS' educational settings.
- Students should not wear tight, body-hugging Manteaux, pants and shirts with uncommon size and color. Manteaux and shirts should be buttoned all the time in educational settings.
- Avoid wearing T-shirts, and sport suits which display improper words and images on them.
- Avoid wearing jewelries including bracelets, necklaces, bangles, gold rings (this does not include wedding rings), and sharp or allergy-causing perfumes in educational settings.
- Keep your nails short, clean, without nail polish. Long or artificial nails are also forbidden.
- Smoking prohibition is strongly emphasized all around school buildings including classrooms, laboratories, offices, work areas, study areas, reception areas, staff-rooms, meeting rooms, restrooms, stairways, eating areas, hallways, elevators, sport complexes and campuses.
- Cosmetics should NOT be worn even in moderation.
